Dear President:

Under provisions of O.C.G.A § 50-36-1, the Secure and Verifiable Identity Document Act (House Bill 87 from the 2011 Session) the Georgia Student Finance Commission (the Commission) is required to ensure that all persons applying for a public benefit are first deemed eligible by virtue of citizenship or foreign national legal status prior to the receipt of such benefit. In order for the Commission to comply with the law in a manner that is the most administratively efficient for all parties (the Commission, students and postsecondary institutions), we have worked with the Department of Law to craft the attached document, ***Private Postsecondary Institutional Participation Agreement for State Programs and Verification of Lawful Presence within the United States*** (the Participation Agreement). This document will replace the existing participation agreement between your institution and the Georgia Student Finance Commission.

The effective date of the new agreement is March 1, 2013. I request that you sign and return this document as soon as possible prior to that date to ensure there is no break in our ability to pay student financial aid invoices to your school. After March 1, 2013, we will suspend all payments to schools that have not returned an executed Participation Agreement.
