MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Fiscal Year 2025 was a year of transition and continued progress for the Georgia Student Finance Commission (GSFC). We bid farewell to President Lynne Riley upon her retirement in March, and since then, our team has worked diligently to uphold the high standards that define GSFC's reputation for excellence.

We are staying focused on our mission of expanding access to postsecondary education for all Georgians, and it has paid off.

- Total HOPE Programs since the program's launch in 1993 surpassed \$16 billion.
- The HOPE Programs have now served more than 2.2 million students.
- In its second year, **GEORGIA MATCH** notified **137,000** students of their college options, positioning Georgia as a national leader in direct admissions.
- The new Georgia Promise Scholarship received 15,300 applications, with 8,500 students meeting eligibility requirements.
- For the first time in over 20 years, **GSFC's state program participants expanded**. In fact, two new institutions joined South College and Luther Rice University.
- In May, our Board of Commissioners visited Georgia Piedmont Technical College in Clarkston to see our impact in action.
- GSFC's Outreach Team met with with nearly 92,000 students at 1,600 events.
- GSFC played a vital role in the **Governor's Workforce Strategy**, collaborating with state partners to implement the **Top State for Talent Act**, signed into law in May.
- On June 1, we co-hosted the Governor's Valedictorian Reception at Georgia State University, where Governor Brian Kemp, USG
 Chancellor Sonny Perdue, TCSG Commissioner Greg Dozier, GSU President Brian Blake, and I celebrated Georgia's top graduates.

I am grateful to our Board of Commissioners for their leadership and proud of GSFC's lasting impact on the lives of our fellow Georgians. While this report offers the numbers, the heart of our work lies in the dedication of our team. May we never lose sight of our mission as we continue to serve Georgia's future.


